The fire brigade had also attended in order to pump water from the A607 properties, and for Health & Safety (H&S) reasons the A607 was closed to through traffic to enable the brigade to carry out their work in safety. There were also problems caused by the excess rainfall along Moat Lane, High Street, Beck Street, Dycote Lane, The Green, and Mulberry Court. Blocked drains had caused most of the problems. The size of the drainpipe under the A607 was inadequate to cope with the flow of the additional rainwater. The chairman has been around the village with a representative from 'Highways', and they have agreed to carry out any remedial work as soon as possible.	LCC
